Tomioka Silk Mill is a Japan's oldest modern model silk reeling factory, established in 1872 by the government to introduce modern machine silk reeling from France and spread its technology in Japan. The factory is designated by the government as a historical site and all its buildings are preserved in very good condition.

In March mNACTEC was invited to participate in the “Industrial Heritage Youth Programme in Tomioka Silk Mill and Related Sites”, an event organized to promote international interchange and academic research on Tomioka Silk Mill.
